ROOKIES Rookie Junior Lifeguard Programme in Action

Earlier this month, our Rookies demonstrated exactly why this programme is so important. While surfing near the club, Rookies Will Magill and Mason Jackson noticed a young boy about 9 years old on a surfboard being dragged out to sea. Will and Mason recount:

"We were just surfing in front of the club, looking out for waves, when we saw the kid about 300 meters offshore. It was clear he was drifting out and struggling. Onshore, we noticed a distressed mum running to the lifeguards and pointing at the boy. As the lifeguards prepared the IRB and radios, we realized the situation was serious. We decided to paddle out to him on our surfboards to help."

Will and Mason reached the boy, reassured him, and attached their leashes to his surfboard, towing him back to shore. They confidently used lifeguarding signals on the way back in to communicate to the regional guards. The boy was safely reunited with his grateful mother and older brother, who later explained they were tourists using rented surfboards.

Head Regional Lifeguard Mitch Cowdrey praised the boys for their quick thinking and effective action. Rookie coaches Jamie Mardon and Ryan Hohneck were thrilled to see the Rookies applying their training in a real-life scenario, emphasizing how the programme fosters vital skills and confidence.

Mason summed it up perfectly: "We just did what we were trained to do, and it felt good to help."

This story highlights the value of the Rookie Junior Lifeguard Programme in preparing young members to step up when it matters most. It's these moments that ensure our community's safety and build the next generation of dedicated lifeguards.

We have a small team taking on the beach and ocean events tomorrow (Friday) plus one canoe crew and a number of members apart of a composite surf boat crew. The canoe and surfboat racing will take place at Pāpāmoa so if you're staying local for the anniversary weekend be sure to come down and watch.









SENIORS

It's been a busy and exciting start to the year for our Senior squad, with training in full swing and weekends packed with carnivals. The team started the year strong, claiming third place on home turf at the BOP Champs, finishing behind Mount Maunganui and winners Omanu. From there, they travelled to Red Beach for the 69th Owen Chapman Carnival. Despite challenging conditions, our small but determined team improved on last year's results, securing third overall behind Omanu and the home team of Red Beach.

Highlights from Red Beach:

- Our U15s gained invaluable experience competing in a tough and highly skilled field.
- The U17s and U19s shone, earning multiple podium finishes in both team and individual events.
- The standout moment was watching some of our clubbies take on the Eliminator race an open event that tests endurance, skill, and determination as competitors are gradually eliminated through mini races. This grueling event includes all disciplines, from swimming and craft racing to flags and a run/wade/run.

Looking ahead, the team is gearing up for one of the season's biggest events this weekend: the ERCs at Mount Maunganui, which attracts top teams from across the country. Racing kicks off Friday with the 2km run and beach sprints, followed by water events over Saturday and Sunday. If you're in the Mount this weekend, be sure to head down to cheer on our incredible athletes as they compete in this highly anticipated carnival.
