

For the first time in four years, Pāpāmoa fielded teams of athletes across the Junior, Senior and Masters Divisions at the National Pool Rescue Championships in Auckland last weekend. The team of 33 broke New Zealand Records, claimed New Zealand titles and finished 7th overall – we were also one of the largest teams present.

The success of our young senior team highlights the ever-growing potential of our Club in the surf sports space, as well as the competence and fitness of our lifeguards. Heading into next year, we anticipate greater results as our team grows larger.

POSITIVE ROLE MODELS INSPIRE SPONSOR




Long term Pāpāmoa employer Guild and Spence Electrical are proud to continue their sponsorship of the Pāpāmoa Surf Life Saving Club this season.

Lifeguard Awards

The first Lifeguard Award of the season will take place in Whakatane on Saturday 12th November. Training sessions for this award are as follows:

- Wednesdays between 5.30pm-7.30pm: 19th & 26th October, 2nd & 9th November
- Sundays between 9.30am-12pm: 23rd & 30th October, 6th November

We will also target the exam dates of 17th December at Omanu and a January exam.
