We'd like to remind members that no personal cars are to be parked within the surf club grounds. We realise parking can be tricky especially as we head into summer, but the grounds need to be kept clear for safety reasons. Thank you for your understanding and support.



Covid in our Community

With an increase in Covid 19 within the community, we need to ensure we are continuing to follow these guidelines from SLSNZ:

- o If you are sick please stay away from the surf club, trainings, patrols, office or meetings.
- o If you have Covid symptoms please take a RAT test and stay at home.
- o If a family member/person you live with tests positive for Covid, please take a RAT test daily for 5 days from the day of their first positive test.
- o If at the surf club for patrol or Beach Ed, wherever possible please aim to open doors and windows to allow good ventilation and air flow.
- o We strongly encourage you to wear masks if in confined spaces with other members or members of the public i.e. in the First Aid Room.
- o Remember to use good hand and personal hygiene.

NEW DEFIB UNIT DONATED TO THE CLUB

Thank you to all our members who contributed to Mark Weedon's Give-a-Little page earlier this year. Mark's family came to the club last week to donate an external AED defib unit to the club, having raised well over \$10k on the page. Mark passed away in August 2021 from a cardiac event.

The beach was Mark's happy place and his partner Kylie says this is why the family chose the Pāpāmoa Surf Club to honour his memory. Mark would be seen down at Pāpāmoa beach every morning having a swim and a coffee – even through the winter.

Kylie set up the Give-a-Little page with the goal of getting more external defib units around the community. They raised enough for 3 units located at the surf club, Pāpāmoa College and Te Akau Ki Pāpāmoa Primary School.



Whilst the surf club has defib units inside the building, the external unit means any member of the public can use it even if the club is closed by calling 111 to get an access code. These units are designed to be operated by people with no first aid knowledge and will help the user administer CPR correctly as well as advise when a shock is needed.

Thank you Kylie, Jack and Rory. You have made a huge difference to the Pāpāmoa community and we know Mark would be very proud.

COULD PATROL SUPPORT BE FOR YOU?



Our Patrol Support people are lifeguards who don't go in the water. If you want to get involved with the club and use your life skills to keep people safe on the beach but you're not keen on the water, then Patrol Support could be for you.

You learn all aspects of setting up for patrol and packing down at the end of the day, including the set up of the flags on the beach and signs. Patrol Support take part in roaming the beach, observe from the tower, give first aid and attend to the flags.

If you have been a lifeguard before, but your swimming isn't quite up to scratch yet or you want to get back into lifeguarding, or maybe you have an injury that prevents you from completing your Lifeguard Refresher at this time, please get in touch.

Stephanie Mardon has just qualified as Patrol Support for this season:

"As a parent, I wish I had completed this course while my kids were doing Junior Surf over the last few years. I have learnt so much from the Patrol Support training with being able to spot rips and different beach conditions to help keep people safe. If you want to contribute to your community, meet new people and be inspired to train (you could set up a Patrol Support swim group and work towards you Lifeguard Award!) then Patrol Support could be for you!"

"I have already used the first aid training for blue bottle stings on the beach in Ohope. My fellow Patrol Supporter and I were actively involved in three cases in about half an hour - two clubbies who were training and a member of the public."
