## KIDS LOVE BEACH ED

Close to 1400 school kids will have been to the Pāpāmoa Surf Club this summer to learn essential water safety messages from our fully qualified lifeguards. Local schools can book students in for these interactive sessions which are a fun way for our kids to learn how to be safe in and around the ocean, as well as learn how to spot and escape from rip currents.





It's not only the children that benefit from these sessions, the parent helpers that come along are often surprised by how much they learn, particularly around spotting rips. It's great to hear that kids are also passing this knowledge on to other family members.

New Zealand has the ninth longest coastline of any nation in the world at nearly 15,000km in length. During the last 10 years, New Zealand has had a 44% higher beach and coastal drowning rate per capita, compared to Australia. Sadly, over the last 10 years, 38% of beach and coastal drownings occurred at a surf beach in NZ. Nearly three in 10 kiwis cannot swim or float in the ocean for more than a few minutes.



We can help to reverse these trends by teaching our kids as early as possible about the dangers of the water and how to be safe at the beach and around rivers and lakes.

Beach Ed is booked through Surf Life Saving New Zealand (SLSNZ) and they are accepting bookings for next summer now, so make sure your school is taking up this opportunity.

## YOUNG LIFEGUARDS STEP UP

Three of our young lifeguards – Sam Clark, Ryan Teixeira and Hannah Edwards – were put to the test last week while on school camp in Whangamata.

The group were kayaking between Whenuakura and Hauturu Islands when Pāpāmoa College Deputy Principal Jane Townsend says she spotted a man in the water who didn't appear to be able to swim and was separated from his kayak. Jane explains what happened:

"Ryan and Sam were in a double kayak and they raced towards the man while I retrieved his kayak. Ryan got in the water and held him up while Luke MacFarlane (another teacher) and Sam pulled him onto the double kayak with him. Sam then paddled the tourist to safety with Ryan in support in the man's kayak. Lifeguard Hannah Edwards also assisted by leading the rest of the class to the island as they were confused and thought we were racing as they hadn't seen the man and his companions in trouble. The other paddlers with the man were too weak to paddle, so I towed them into shore and phoned the kayak company. I was extremely proud of these students!"

The Pāpāmoa Surf Lifesaving Club is also very proud of these young lifeguards who really stepped up when it counted.
